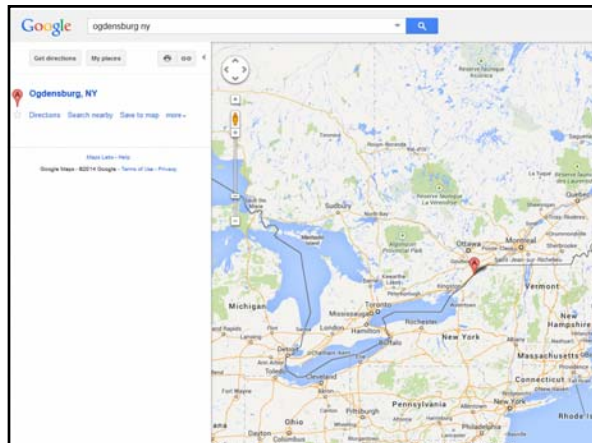
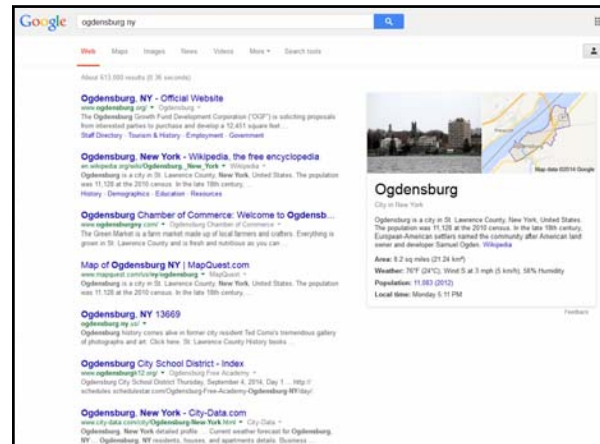

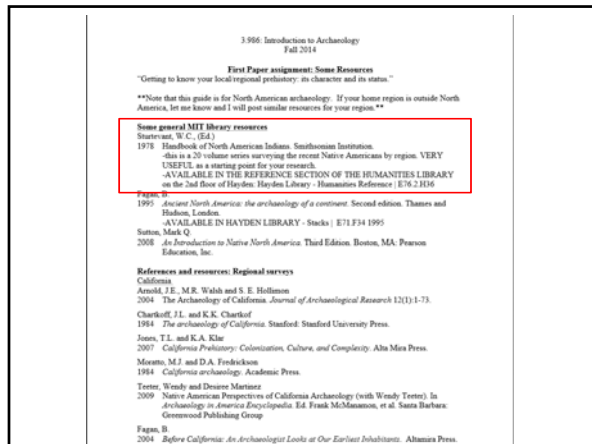

5. Visit other area libraries

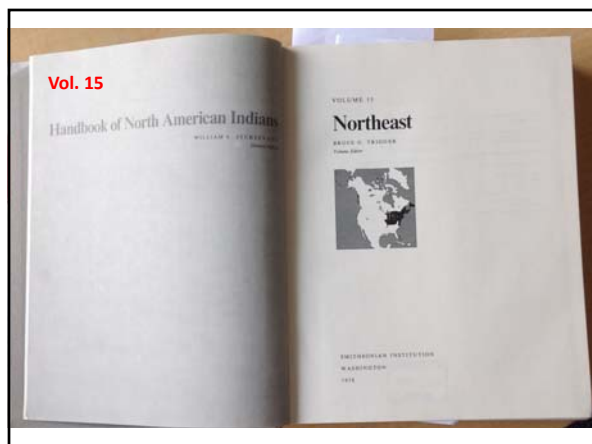
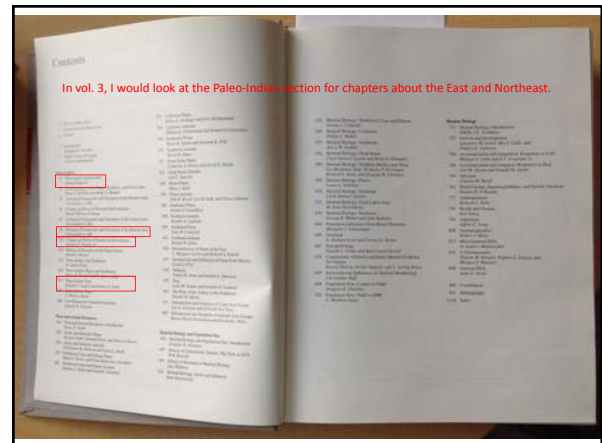
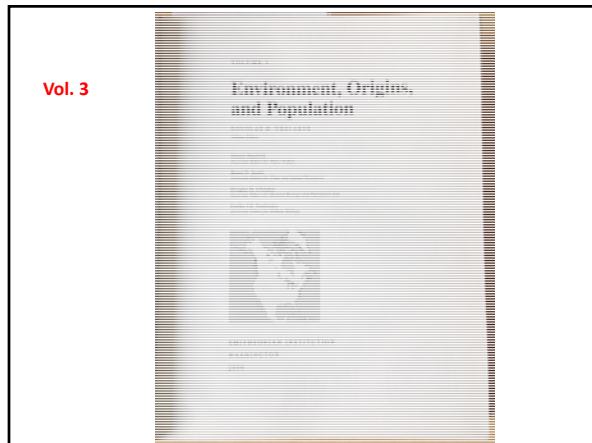

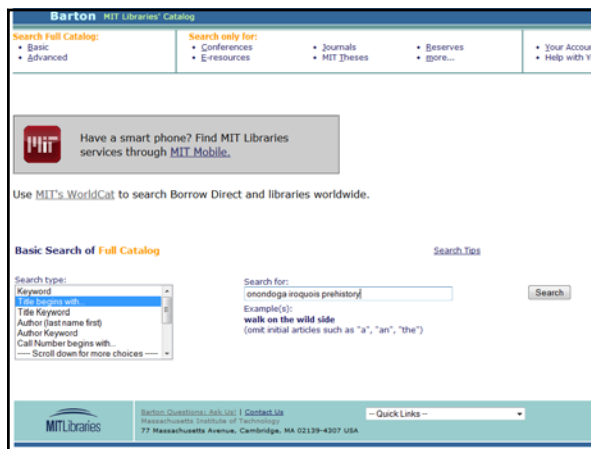
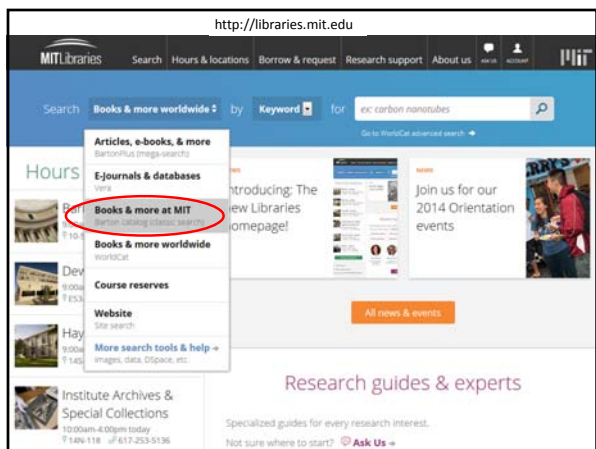
- It's a classic work and a great starting place if your home region is North America

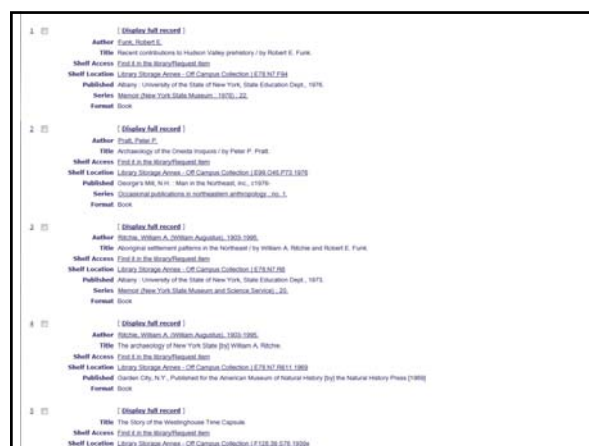
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Abstract and Keywords

The cultural sequence of the St. Lawrence Lowlands was first elaborated for New York state. This was then followed by Ontario, and later Quebec and the Maritimes and Newfoundland. Each region has since developed a more detailed regional sequence, giving a local flavor to archaeological systematics, but it remains possible to construct a general framework for the entire St. Lawrence and adjacent regions, probably because this major artery exercised a strong homogenizing factor, facilitating exchanges between distant groups. This article aims to present the major cultural achievements that took place along the St. Lawrence Valley, corresponding geographically to the Laurentian Lowlands, extending west to east from Lake Ontario to the Gulf of St. Lawrence. The order of presentation is chronological.

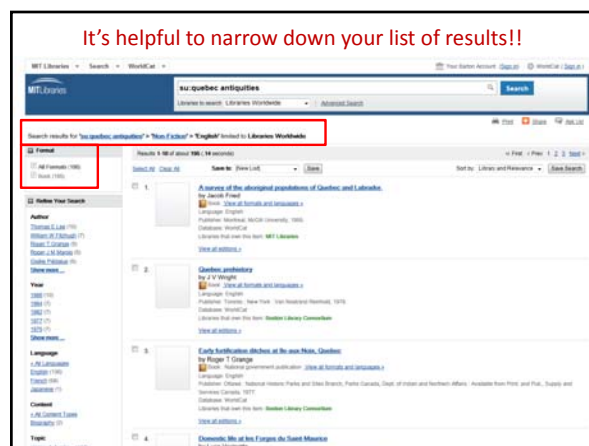
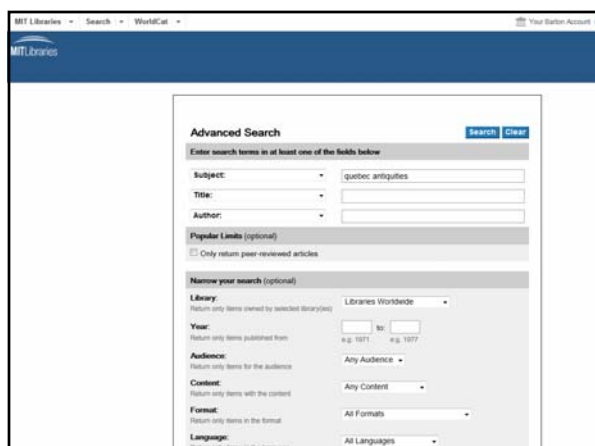

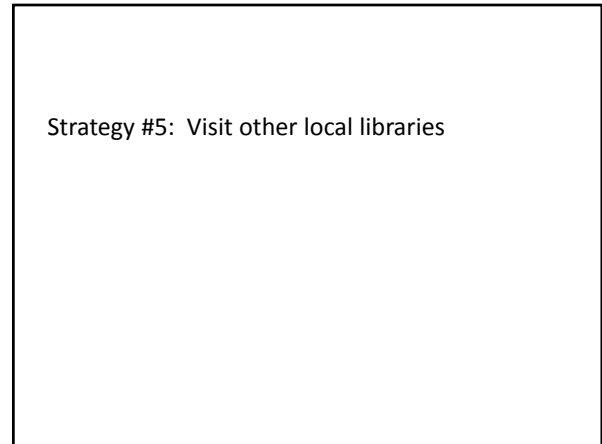
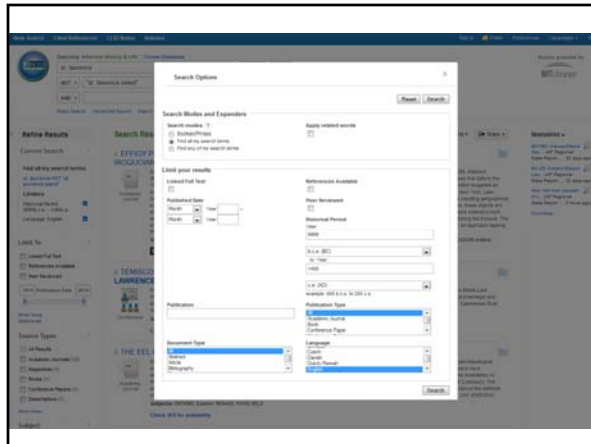
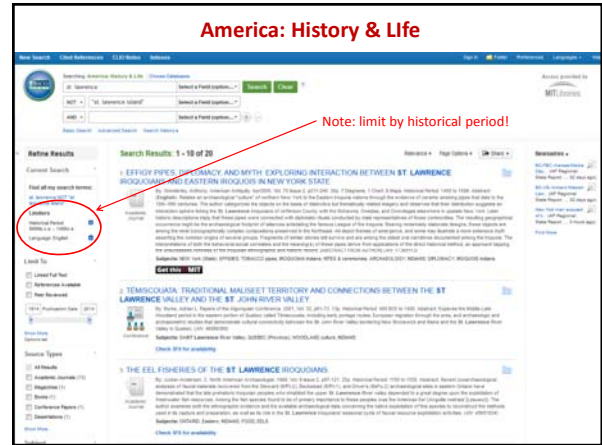
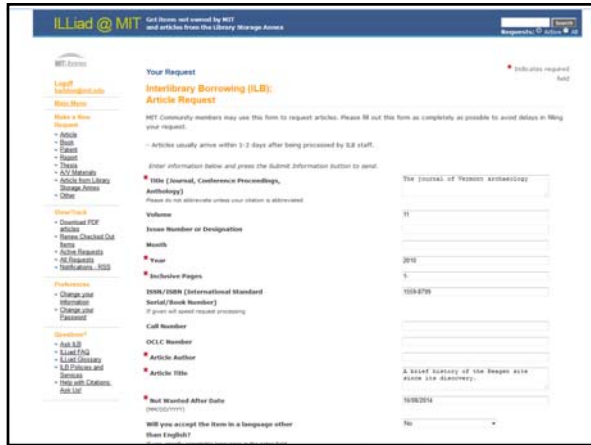
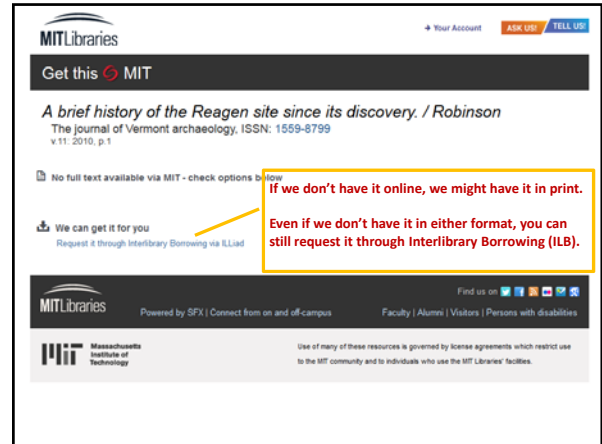
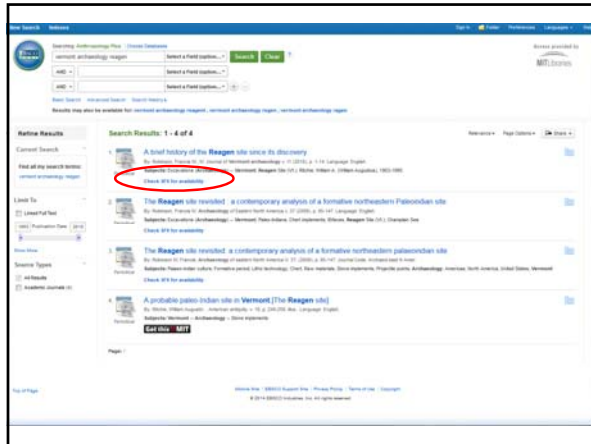
- We've searched for "known items" (specific books). What about books we don't know about yet?
- We can search Barton and Worldcat based on what we found in earlier searches of "known items."

- Keep in mind that our geographical categories and boundaries now might not map to prehistory.
- So, for Northern New York, I might also want to look at Ontario, Quebec, and Vermont.
- I'll use the subject heading "New York (State)—Antiquities" as a model.
